Payment Payment

Payment options include Qkr! app as well as Direct Debit and the Pay Now function on the Xplor Home app. Please ensure fees are paid in full within 7 days from date on the statement.

Cancellations

Cancellations need to be made by 6pm Friday 5th April (Week 10 Term 1) to meet fair work staffing requirements. A medical certificate will be required to waive fees if a cancellation occurs after this date.

Medication

If you require educators to administer your child with any medication, please inform us so appropriate paper work can be completed and ensure we have current medical plans onsite. All medication must be in the original container, clearly labelled with the child's name legible, and a valid expiry date.

Sun Protection

Children <u>MUST</u> wear an appropriate hat EVERYDAY they attend Vacation Care (legionnaires or broad brimmed with no chin strap). Caps are not acceptable. Spare OSHC hats will be used when going on excursions and sunblock will be available to all children. If your child is allergic to a particular brand of sunblock please provide them with their own.

Excursions

Children must be at OSHC no later than the departure time specified on the program for the excursion day. If you are late it may result in your child/ren missing out on the excursion. Children are not permitted to bring spending money unless stated on the program. We travel by private bus to and from our destinations unless stated otherwise and when travelling outside the CBD we use a bus with seatbelts.

Important Information: On days where extreme weather is forecast (for example; the temperature is 36 degrees or above or heavy rain is expected) excursions or incursions which require prolonged outdoor activities will be cancelled. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, excursions may be cancelled at short notice.

Food and Drink

Children will need to bring a healthy recess and lunch (unless stated otherwise on the program) and a drink bottle every day they attend. If a drink bottle is not provided on an excursion day one will be supplied to your child at an additional cost. Please note; we are a strictly nut aware service, therefore do not use peanut butter, Nutella or other nut products.

Clothing and Footwear

Children's shoulders are to be covered at all times. Tank tops, shoe string straps or strapless tops are NOT allowed. Children must wear enclosed shoes at all times; sandals that have an ankle strap are acceptable. If we are going on a water excursion they may bring thongs to change into. Should your child/ren be dropped off with inappropriate clothing or footwear, OSHC educators have the right to exclude them from excursions or planned activities.

Toys and Electronics from Home

Children are NOT permitted to bring ANY toys or electronics from home unless stated otherwise on the program. Educators have the right to keep them in a lockable cupboard until the child is collected if they are brought in. If electronics are brought to the service on Electronics Day they MUST be signed in and out on the electronics register located next to the roll. Electronics are brought into the service at their own risk. OSHC assumes no responsibility for lost or broken devices.


